BACKGROUND:

In 2015, the City Council of the City of Monticello approved Ordinance 2015-02, thus creating the current residential waste hauler license structure with a total of four available licenses.

Key elements of that Ordinance were to continue promoting recycling and tried to provide a sticker program for those residents that so desire a “pay by usage” type of system. Currently three licenses are available with only one hauler licensed. Since 2015, the City has had as many as three licensed residential waste haulers operating at the same time.

In 2018, the City Council of the City of Monticello discussed abandoning the licensure program and transitioning into a single hauler system with a competitive request for proposal bid for the residential waste hauling.

I have attached the Residential Refuse and Recycling Collection Program – Request for Proposals that accompanied Ordinance 2018-47 for your review prior to Monday evenings meeting. Ordinance 2018-47 failed by a five to two vote with one absent on November 13, 2018.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

It is recommended that the City Council begin discussing a single hauler residential refuse and recycling collection system. Amendments to the attached request for proposal can be incorporated for future Council consideration. This is for discussion only.
